

## **CRESTOR**

Crestor was approved as a cholesterol-lowering drug by the FDA in August of 2003. Like Baycol, use of Crestor may result in a potentially deadly muscle-damaging side effect called Rhabdomyolysis. Baycol was pulled from the market in 2001. Now the consumer advocacy group Public Citizen is lobbying to get Crestor pulled from the market as well. Public Citizen has requested a criminal investigation of AstraZeneca, the manufacturer of Crestor, for what it calls an illegal delay in the submission of serious adverse reaction reports to the FDA.
